History

The SPIA (Soldiers for Peace International Association) is an international association founded on November 19th, 1988. It is provided with a general consultative status from the resolution 12-96 (XLIV) adopted by the attribution committee of the United Nations Economic and Social Council on July 3rd, 1995.

The headquarters of the organization is based at Lyon, in France, and has multiple offices all around the world. Its founder and actual president is Mr Laurent Attar-Bayrou.

The SPIA's missions:

- Maintaining peace: coordinate and carry out actions for peace, train future Blue Helmets, manage of sites and form former military
- Be a proposition force for the United Nations
- Social and humanitarian actions: help and support harmed Blue Helmets, their widows and their orphans
- Serve the principles of the United Nations Charter
- Gather more the 1 million Blue Helmets who have participated in the peacekeeping operations (PO) since 1948 by creating associations
- Conflict resolutions

Academy of the Peace



The Academy of the Peace proposes formations, theoretical and practical courses on the Peacekeeping, security and peace culture. It hosts humanitarian actors, former military, diplomats, and jurists. It aspires to be a practical and effective link on the field.

International Young Peacemakers Program

In partnership with scholar establishments, this program relates to children interested in peace or wishing to do good around them by citizenship and peace actions. It lasts a year, but is renewable on 3 years.



Sport and health for the promotion of peace program

Promote peace by the practice of sport. It allows to create a spirit of collaboration around a same ambition and to learn individual and collective values: courage, honor, respect and fairplay.

Diplomas and medals are attributed to the students to congratulate them on their actions.
